Some have noticed that we now have a new logo and have asked what the pelican in the crest stands for. Here is your answer:

According to legend, in a time of famine a mother pelican would draw blood from her own chest and give the blood to her chicks.

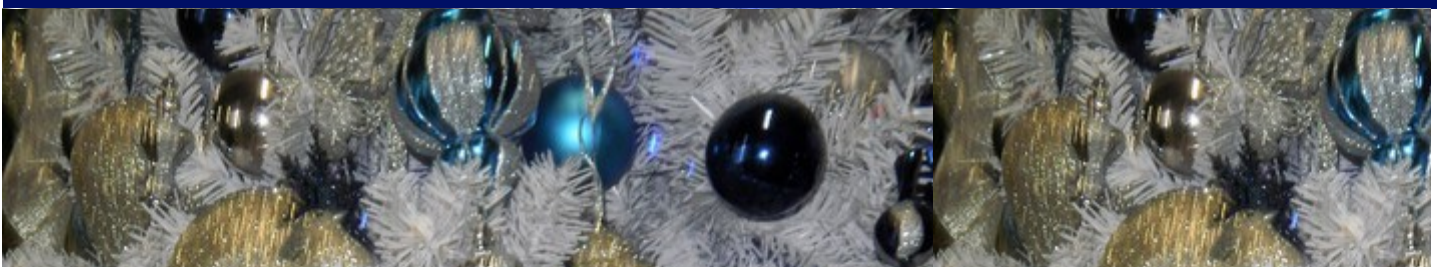
Thus the **pelican symbol** in Christianity, also called pelican-in-her-piety, symbolizes the sacrifice of Christ on the cross (because he gave his blood for others) as well as the Eucharist (because it represents Christ's blood and provides spiritual nourishment).

Globus Cruciger (Latin, "cross-bearing orb"), also known as the orb and cross, an orb (Latin globus) topped (Latin gerere, to wear) by a cross (Latin crux), has been a Christian symbol of authority since the Middle Ages. The cross represents Christ's dominion over the orb of the world, literally held in the hand of an earthly ruler.

Papal tiara and keys are a symbol of the Pope's authority and the keys of St Peter.

The triple crown means teaching, governing and sanctifying office of the church.

The color blue is for the Blessed Virgin Mary.

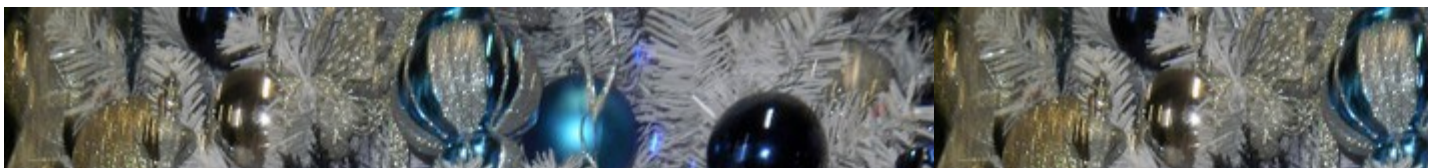
